Comprehensive Needs Assessment Summary

What data did our team examine?

eCBM data: historical (last 5 years) as well as current eCBM data. CFA (Common Formative Assessment Data). SWIS data. A2A Attendance data.

How did the team examine the different needs of all learner groups?

Disaggregated data was examined during grade level Intervention Review Meetings. CORE (all school, grade-level data is reviewed and discussed at Fall, Winter and Spring benchmark assessment periods.

How were inequities in student outcomes examined and brought forward in planning?

Each student was discussed in the Intervention Review Meetings, consideration was given to each student's academic and social-emotional needs. Our teams considered each student's prior educational experience (many interruptions and different modes of instruction have taken place over the last several school years due to the COVID-19 pandemic), past academic performance within standardized assessments as well as classroom performance, and each student's home/family situation.

What needs did our data review elevate?

Our students are still challenged by the effects of interruptions in their education stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic. In reading one of the greatest needs our data revealed was a need to increase reading fluency. At the younger grades this starts with fluency in reading words (WRF) and in 2nd grade and up, we target passage reading fluency (PRF). In our 5th grade, students have a greater need in the area of comprehension, so this was the area chosen for focus.

In math, we focus on grade level standards, all of which we assess using the grade-level Common Formative Assessments. We know our students struggle with fundamentals, especially in the area of math facts. We are not only targeting this need within daily instruction, but also through the implementation and use of Imagine Learning Math facts. This process has been incentivized so that students work to “master” different fact families (+,-,x,/) to earn recognition and awards.

How were stakeholders involved in the needs assessment process?

School staff, our School Leadership Team, and staff who are also parents of Aiken students were included in this process. SLT meetings have been strategically scheduled to occur the day prior to each monthly Aiken PTO meeting. This was done in order to support fluid communication from SLT outcomes/decisions to the PTO members. At each PTO meeting the principal gives an SLT report and collects feedback from the greater parent group (PTO), to bring back to the SLT team. The goal is that this feedback loop is used to more readily modify and improve SLT plans as the year progresses.

Which needs will become priority improvement areas? Note: Priorities describe where the team intends to go but do not describe how the team will get there. An example priority might be to improve graduation rates or that all students will meet their growth goals.

Aiken students will meet growth goals in the areas of grade level math standards, as evidenced by their performance on grade level CFA (Common Formative Assessment) assessments, as well as meet growth goals in either reading

comprehension or fluency (this differs by grade level/need) as evidenced by eCBM measures given throughout the year.

<p>District or School Goal this strategy supports</p>	<p>Goal 3: Parent Involvement</p> <p>By May 2023, Aiken staff will have increased the number of family events hosted at Aiken by 50% from the 2021-2022 school year. There were 9 opportunities for Aiken families to attend on-site activities within the 21-22 school year. In the 2022-2023 school year our goal is to increase this by 50%, offering at least 14 <u>Aiken hosted</u> activities for Aiken families to participate in. (This is in addition to any OSD hosted events.)</p> <p>21 family events were hosted at Aiken in the 22-23 school year, overall our family events were increased by a rate of 230%, well exceeding our initial goal of increasing events by 50%.</p> <p>We know the more opportunities we provide for families, the more likely they are to be able to find an activity that works with their schedule and attend. We also want to focus setting up these events through the lens of overcoming any barriers to attending, that some of our families may have (language, comfort in building, time of events, etc.) .</p>

Also, if we focus on the specific needs of our Hispanic parents (in terms of what they share with us would help them access more parent involvement opportunities and support them in helping their children with schoolwork at home) Then staff and family members will build more meaningful, relationships, And our Hispanic families will have greater access and opportunities to not only participate in parent involvement activities, but also to help their students with their learning at home. This emphasis on removing any barriers for our Hispanic families will increase the overall participation of ALL of Aikens families in our family activities.</p>
