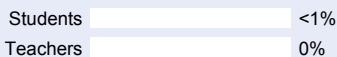

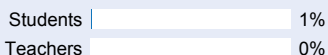

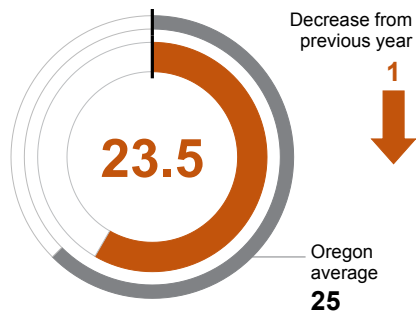

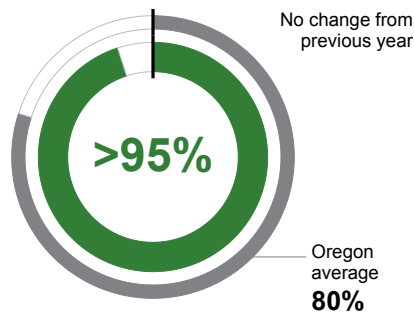

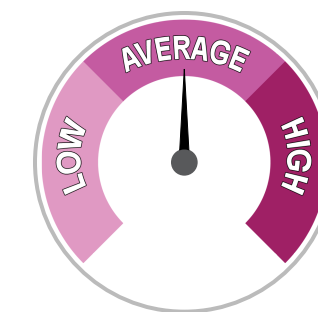

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

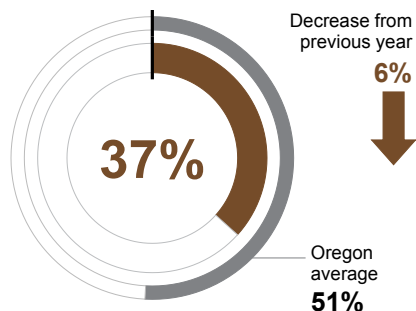
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

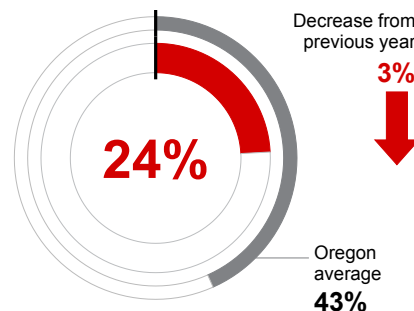
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

School Goals

At Aiken we place great emphasis on both academics and positive behavior traits. To make certain Aiken students have access to every opportunity to learn, one of the priorities at Aiken is great attendance. Through our Attention 2 Attendance program, we work with students and parents to inform them of the importance of regular attendance. Due to this work, we have seen the attendance rate for our school increase over the last several years.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

At Aiken Elementary, we strive to ensure all students and their families feel welcome. We have multiple bilingual staff members including front office staff. All communication sent home through mail, phone, text, and hand delivered notes is translated. We provide interpreters at parent/teacher conferences, IEP meetings, and other school meetings.

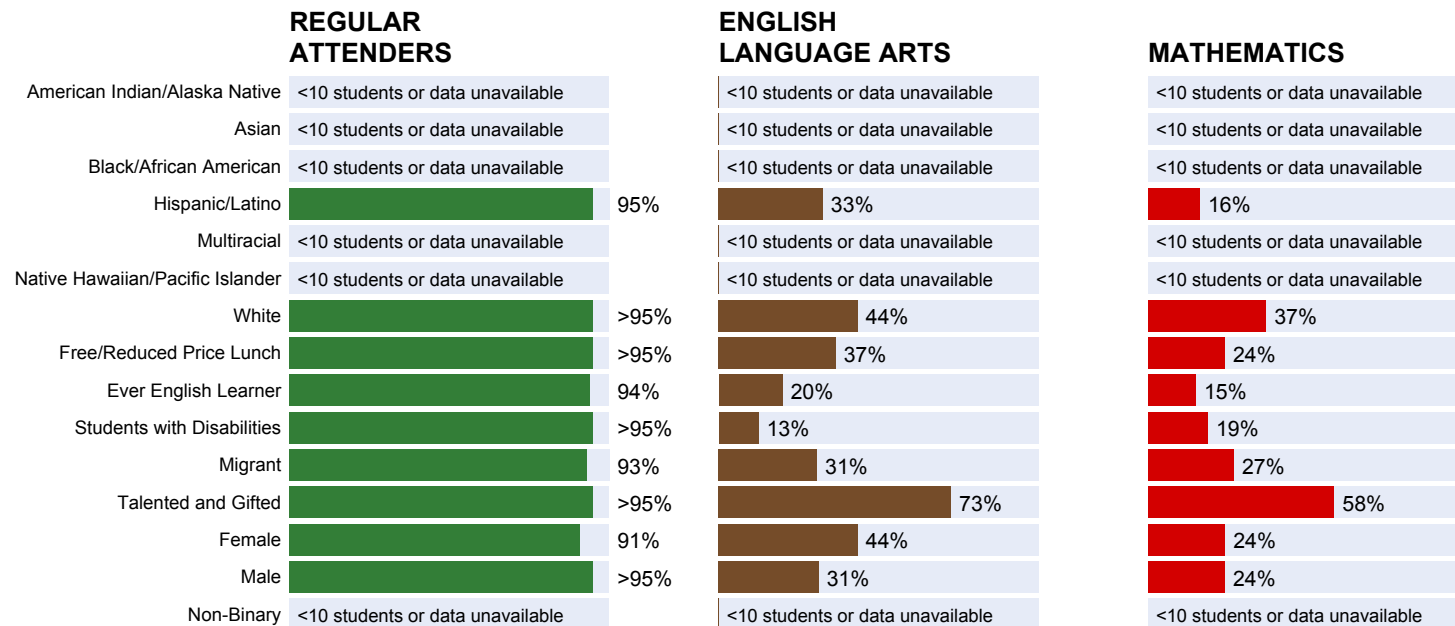

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

To ensure a safe and secure learning environment for all students, we implemented Positive Behavior Intervention Supports (PBIS) as one of the ways to support students. We participate in Anti-Bully Week, providing awareness and tools for parents and students. We also have a school counselor who supports students and families. The counselor provides classroom lessons along with small group and individual support lessons. Our goal is to provide a safe and nurturing environment where all students can grow.
