







School Goals

At Cairo Elementary, we believe in educating the whole child. We place an emphasis on both academics and positive behavior traits. We also have a strong emphasis on the connection of attendance to school success. Through our Attention 2 Attendance program, we work with students and parents to inform them of the importance of regular attendance. Due to this work, we have seen the attendance rate for our school increase over the last year.

State Goals






