



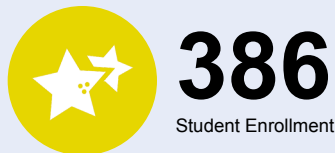

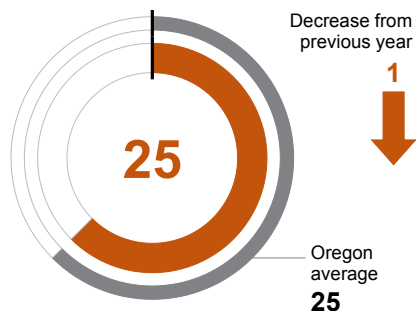

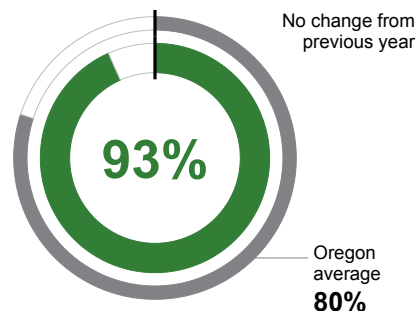
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

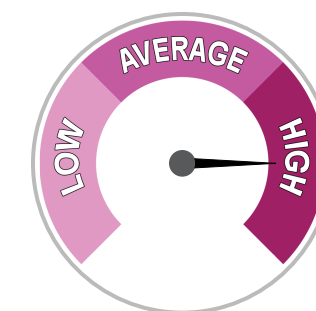

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

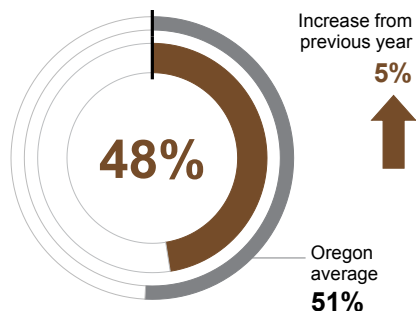
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

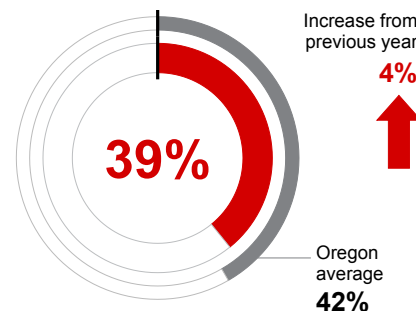
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

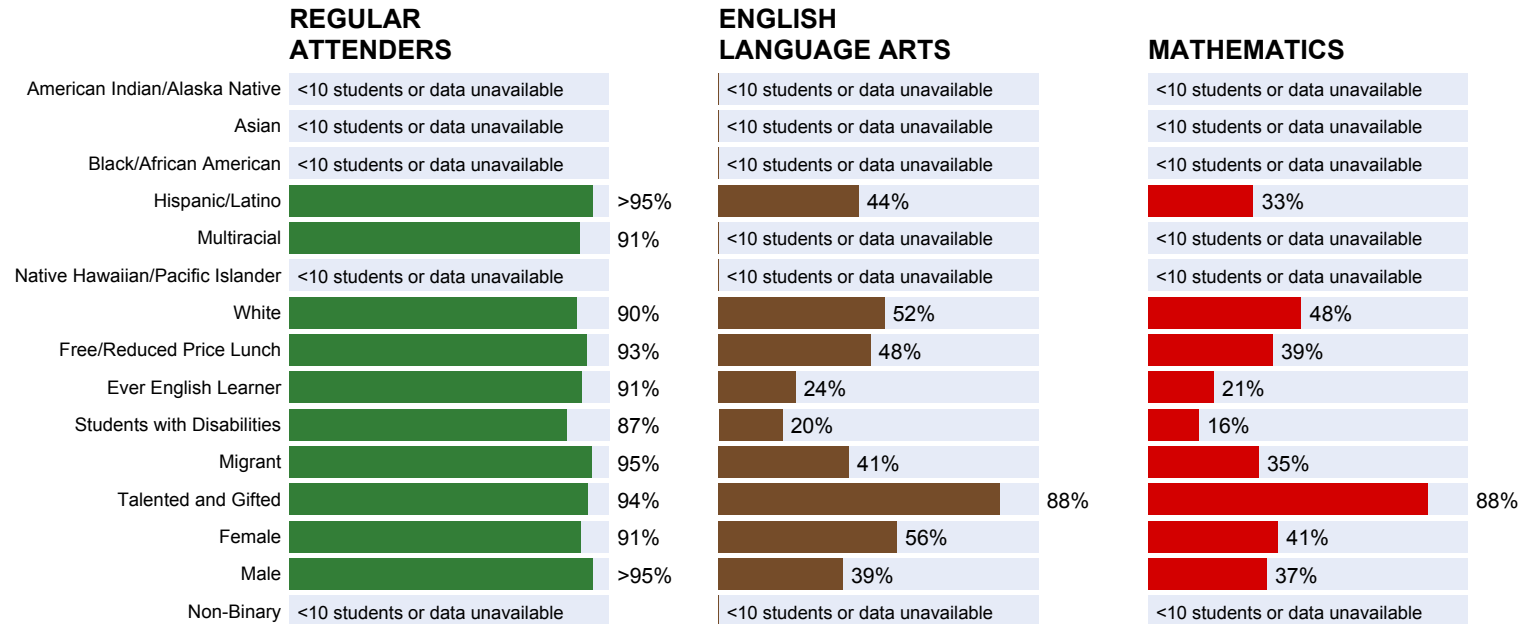

About Our School

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Communication is key when it comes to maintaining a positive school culture. Our staff has been trained to recognize and remediate those harmful student behaviors. Our goal is to provide a safe and nurturing environment where all students can grow. We have an anonymous reporting system available to all students, parents and community members. School safety is our number one school priority therefore, we engage in emergency planning and trainings with the staff and students on a regular basis.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Alameda believes in offering enriching opportunities for kids. Extracurricular activities offered via Ontario Parks and Recreation Department teach team work and offer a great environment for social growth. Interactive math, science and reading family nights Extended day program with emphasis on science and engineering, exploration and design Web-based individualized math, reading keyboarding programs accessible for home study. Extended day reading, math and language development programs for identified student Competitive Lego Robotic teams and newly formed Student Leadership is offered at Alameda.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Alameda encourages parents and the community to participate in our school by inviting them in for events like our Back to school night, "Super Hero" Walk-a-thon, Science night, PTO, and Book Fair. Parents are invited to attend both our school and district family nights where we focus on building relationships while providing fun, academic opportunities for parents to engage with their children. We strive for 100% participation in parent-teacher conferences and encourage communication with parents via social media, texting, email, and phone calls.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Alameda has many community partners. Oregon State University and the Malheur Educational Service district host a science event where all students in our school experience a star lab. We partner with the foster grandparent program where elderly community members are encouraged to come in and connect with students while assisting them with their reading and math. We partner with Help them to Hope food drive program, the Boys and Girls Club, Bureau of Land Management, Four Rivers Cultural Center, Ontario Police, Malheur County Sheriff's department, OMSI, Oregon State Police and Ontario Fire and Rescue and National Guard Armory who all interact with our students. Alameda also hosts an annual Spaghetti Feed where over 500 community members attend and experience our school.
