

### **Diploma Option Information**

Ontario School District offers a variety of diploma options to graduating students upon completion of one of four prescribed credit programs.

These include the Oregon Standard, Modified, and Extended Diplomas and the Ontario Alternative Certificate.

All four diplomas represent satisfactory completion of a valid and accredited program.

#### **Alternate Certificate**

An Alternate Certificate may be earned by students if they are unable to meet the requirements for any other diploma option. Requirements will be determined by a school team and may be individualized to best meet student needs.

#### **Graduation Exercises**

Only students in good standing who have successfully completed the requirements for a Standard, Modified, Extended Diploma, or Alternate Certificate may participate in graduation exercises.

Oregon students who receive a Standard, Modified, or Extended Diplomas are eligible to apply for federal financial aid. In addition, students may also be eligible to apply to some branches of the military.

Conferment of a Modified or an Extended Diploma does not guarantee admittance to a post-secondary institution, but does allow a student to be eligible for federal financial aid or may allow for some branches of military service.

Students completing any of the diploma options are eligible for graduation exercises. ### Diploma Options

There are a variety of diploma options to fit the needs of all students. Within this brochure are descriptions of the requirements for meeting the criteria of each option. Choosing the right option for you or your student will have life-long implications. It is essential to be well-informed.

### Standard Diploma

A 24-credit Standard Diploma may be granted to students who have been academically successful and who are presently achieving school success or to students transferring to Ontario as seniors.

### Modified Diploma

A 24-credit Modified Diploma is awarded to a student who, under modified conditions and curricula, has completed all of the state requirements. A Modified Diploma is subject to limitations of the guidelines below:

- Documented history of the student's inability to maintain grade-level achievement due to significant learning and instructional barriers, or achievement barriers due to medical condition.
- Building review team or an IEP team will decide whether the student should work toward a modified diploma no earlier than the end of sixth grade and no later than two years before the student's anticipated exit from high school.
- Building review team establishes modified curriculum and it is noted as such on transcripts.
- Building review team may formally decide to revise a modified diploma decision, but requires course credits that were modified must be retaken without modifications track.
- Any modifications in demonstrating proficiencies in Essential Skills, Career-related Learning Standards, Career-related Learning Experiences, Education Plan & Profile, and Extended Application places the student on a modified track.

Students currently engaged in the use of illegal drugs and/or alcohol are not eligible for a modified diploma if the significant learning and instructional barriers are due to the use of illegal drugs and/or alcohol. Students who are in, have completed a supervised drug or alcohol rehabilitation program or have been rehabilitated and are no longer using illegal drugs or alcohol, may be eligible for a modified diploma.

### Extended Diploma

An Extended Diploma may be awarded only through the Individualized Education Plan (IEP) team process and only to students on IEPs who complete the required 12 units of credit.

The diploma is subject to limitations identified in the guidelines listed below:

- A student will be considered a candidate for the Extended Diploma if s/he cannot meet the full set of academic content standards for the Standard or Modified Diploma with reasonable accommodations and modifications. In addition, the student must meet the following eligibility criteria:
- Documented history of the inability to maintain grade-level achievement due to significant learning and instructional barriers inherent in the student or documented history of a medical condition that creates a barrier to achievement, and
- Participation in an alternate state assessment beginning no later than grade six and lasting for two or more assessment cycles or a serious injury that occurs after grade 8 and that changes the student's ability to participate in grade-level activities and that results in the student participating in alternate assessments.
