3. This is a gifting project. Remember this is about gifting and not always expecting to find a rock or get recognition when yours is found.

4. Do not hide rocks in national parks or state parks, on private property, or cemeteries. Do not hide rocks in grass where they could damage lawn mowers.


5. Pinterest and Facebook are great places to find inspiration for colorful creations and creative messages.


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Instructions Day 2
